At the January club meeting a member asked if beach areas in Washington State Parks were closed to detecting. There was some confusion about this so, I have attached a link to the Washington State Parks and Recreation website that addresses metal detecting guidelines in the State Parks. On that website is also an list of the parks. Click on the park name and it will take you to a map that shows the currently allowed detecting area for that park. You may also download a brochure and registration form that you must fill out and leave at the park you decide to detect in. Here's the link: https://parks.state.wa.us/127/Metal-detecting

Remember that if you want a particular area in any of the parks opened up to detecting, please forward your request or concerns to the MDAW folks so that they may address it when they meet with the Parks personnel. See the MDAW information near the bottom of page 1 of this newsletter.

Code of Ethics

In order to protect your hobby it's important to follow the metal detecting code of ethics-

- 1. Follow all local, state, and federal laws related to metal detecting.
- 2. Respect private property and never metal detect an area without permission.
- 3. Pack out what you pack in, and properly dispose of any trash you find.
- 4. Leave all gates, structures, and personal property as they were before.
- 5. Fill in every hole you dig. Leave no trace you were there.
- 6. Never dig in a way that harms vegetation, wildlife, or changes natural features.
- 7. Report any significant historical artifacts to local authorities.
- 8. Be an ambassador for the hobby by being courteous and thoughtful at all times.

Another thing to keep in mind is that people will probably ask questions when they see you out metal detecting. By following these guidelines you'll set a good example for detectorists everywhere, and you might even spark someone's interest in the hobby.
