I was a cook during my time in the service, plus while in Vietnam I worked as a gunner on the helicopters to earn combat pay. As a cook in Vietnam I got to see Bob Hope along with his whole traveling group of ladies come through the chow line.

US NAVY 1954 - 1958 Radioman DD718

I am vet. Retired out of the Army. Twelve out of twenty in Special Forces and three years in Vietnam. Was president of the PTHC 1986 to 1999.

Stationed in Inchon, South Korea with the 8th Army. Met my wife, Sue, there - still married after 55 years. I was assigned to Graves Registration and because there were no deaths they reassigned me to Captain's jeep driver. Sue and I toured a lot of South Korea on our off time.

To our veterans, thank you for your selflessness and bravery to serve our country and protect its people.

The origin of Veterans Day is November 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of WWI: "Armistice Day" (the "eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month" of 1918). The national holiday observance started in 1938, honors all American veterans, living or dead, and was renamed to Veterans Day in 1954.

Additional facts from history.com:

- 18.2 million living veterans served during at least one war as of 2018
- 9 percent of veterans are women
- 7 million veterans served during the Vietnam War
- 3 million veterans have served in support of the War on Terrorism
- Of the 16 million Americans who served during World War II, about 496,777 were still alive as of 2018
- Connecticut was home to the highest percentage of World War II veterans as of 2018 at 7.1 percent
- 2 million veterans served during the Korean War
- As of 2017, the top three states with the highest percentage of Veterans were Alaska, Maine, and Montana, respectively
