If you plan to metal detect in one of the State Parks, be sure to verify where you are still allowed to hunt with the on-site Ranger or find the updated map on the Parks Department website BEFORE you go out!

The subjects of these meetings have been the recent severe restrictions and closures of many of the Washington State Parks to metal detecting. We have recently forwarded (to Pilchuck Treasure Hunting Club members that receive this newsletter via email) three emails from MDAW that detail some of these closures plus some recent reports from MDAW regarding the results of these meetings.
