# "Exonimia" - ----"A token hobby!" (Haven't heard of this before, have you?!)

#### What is Exonimia?

According to the Token and Medal Society, Exonumia (I personally never heard of this before!!) was defined by TAMS founding member, Russell Rulau in 1960. It refers to collectible items, other than coins or paper money, such as medals or tokens. Most collectors expand that definition to include an even wider range of similar types of items. Among the items we find while metal detecting we sometimes dig up various types of "trade tokens" which are usually "Good for" something tokens; like a nickel beer, a pool game, 5 cents in trade or more recently (like Chucky Cheese) a video or amusement game, a car wash, etc.

This month (and for a couple more months or until we tire of the subject) we will take a look at this interesting part of metal detecting. I want to start with introducing you to fellow Pilchuck Treasure Hunting Club member, Wally Stier ( <a href="www.tier@aol.com">www.tier@aol.com</a>). Wally is the Washington & Alaska Editor for the online resource, "Tokencatalog" (<a href="www.tokencatalog.com">www.tokencatalog.com</a>). Wally is a great guy to talk to for information about token collecting, identifying and information. He has been kind enough to contribute the following.

What are tokens? Tokens have been in use for centuries. They have been used for advertising, identification, recognition, tickets, prizes, and substitutes for coinage. More recently, they have been frequently used in vending, and amusement machines and a variety of self-service devices. Unlike coins, tokens have seldom been made of precious metals such as silver and gold. Most tokens from the 19th and early 20th centuries were often made from copper, brass, nickel-silver and after 1895 – aluminum. Plastic tokens began to appear in the 1950's.

What is Tokencatalog.com? Tokencatalog is a free on-line searchable database of world tokens started in 2007. Currently, there are about 425,000 listings of various kinds of tokens. The majority of listings are for merchant trade tokens – that is, tokens issued by merchants which are "good for" something. Other listings include transportation, parking, carwash, civil war, military, tax, prison and commemorative tokens. Wooden nickels and encased coins are also catalogued. A unique feature of the database is that users can contribute information about tokens they have, even if they do not know where the tokens are from.

How do I use the catalog? Guests can sign-on to the database at www.tokencatalog.com there is no fee for use. If you register, an email address and name are required - - no user information is ever published or sold. The search feature of the database can be useful in obtaining information about a token which is not self-identified - a maverick or one that has no location information such as a city or state. Keep in mind that there have been several hundred thousand tokens of various kinds issued over the last 150 years and the database is therefore quite limited in scope.
